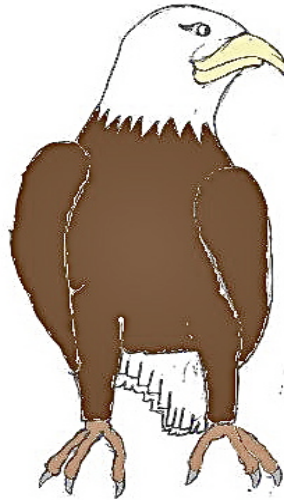

*Each member of SeDoMoCha's community; students, parents/guardians, teachers, administrators, and staff share responsibility for making SeDoMoCha a healthy, safe, pleasant, and productive place to learn and work. Students will be held responsible for exhibiting behavior that maintains these principles. Students who choose not to exhibit the SOAR principles will be held accountable by experiencing respectful and reasonable consequences for their actions.

* The School Board advises the public that the proper channeling of complaints involving instruction, discipline, or learning materials is as follows:

1. Teacher
2. Principal
3. Superintendent
4. Board of Directors

Cafeteria Procedures

- Use quiet voices and appropriate talk
- Sit down
- Keep your hands and feet to yourself
- Use good manners
- Walk
- Clean up after yourself and others
- Raise your hand for assistance

Assembly Procedures

- Take care of all bathroom needs before assembly
- **No gum, food, or drinks**
- Enter assembly area quietly when called
- Follow adult directions the first time given
- Sit as instructed in assigned area/group
- Respect others' personal space by keeping hands, feet, and objects to self
- Eyes and ears on the speaker
- Ask appropriate questions
- Applaud appropriately and when appropriate
- Inform adult of unsafe behavior, incidents or bullying
- Exit assembly area quietly when called

Cell Phone/Electronic Device Procedures

- As students enter the building cell phones and any other electronic devices must be turned off
- The only place students will store cell phones and any other electronic devices during the school day will be in lockers/cubbies/backpack
- The students may not turn on their cell phones and/or any other electronic devices until dismissed from the Classroom at the end of the day
- Any lost, stolen, or damaged cell phones and/or any other electronic devices are the responsibility of the students and their guardians. The school is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged devices
- At any point during the day, employees may check that all devices are appropriately stowed and have the right to confiscate if it is not appropriately stowed
- Any confiscated cell phone or device will be turned into the office where the student may get it back at the end of the day

Departure Procedures

Bus Dismissal Procedures

- Wait in your designated area until your bus number is called
- Walk directly to your assigned bus in a single file line
- Leave personal space for people around you when entering the bus

Car Rider Dismissal Procedures

- Wait in your designated area until car pick-ups are dismissed
- Walk quietly to the designated car pick-up area and meet up with your ride

Walker/Bike Dismissal Procedures

- Wait in designated area until walkers are dismissed
- Walk quietly to the designated exit and leave the building quietly

Emergency Drill Procedures

- When the alarm sounds or an announcement is made, form a line quickly and quietly
- Lights out
- Doors closed
- Windows closed (if possible)
- Teachers take orange go-bags and close the door
- Proceed out of the building in an orderly fashion
- Form a quiet line in predetermined location
- Stand facing away from the building
- Listen quietly for any further directions
- Re-enter building when instructed to do so

Playground Procedures

General Procedures (Kindergarten-Fourth)

- Keep hands and feet to self.
- When you hear two short whistle blows stop what you are doing and look for teacher.
- When you hear one long whistle blow line up and get ready to go inside.

Playground Equipment

- On climbers, go up everything except slide
- On climbers, go down slide and stairs
- On the slide go up the stairs and go down slide on bottom
- On the swings, sit on your bottom swinging forward and backward only
- On the monkey bars, if your feet are on a bar your hands should be on a bar as well. Stay off the top.

Kindergarten and First Grade Exceptions

- On spider web, if your feet are on a rope your hands should be on a rope
**Second through eighth grade students are not allowed on the spider web.
Fifth through eighth grade students are not allowed on the elementary equipment.*

Equipment

- Use all equipment respectfully
- Use equipment properly
- Return equipment to Classroom when finished
- Let teacher know when equipment goes over the fence

Field (Fourth-Eighth Grade Only)

- Share space on field for different activities
- Follows rules of the games
- Keep fields in good playing condition
